Cultural Exchange: Promote scholarly and cultural interactions among participants from diverse geographical and disciplinary backgrounds.

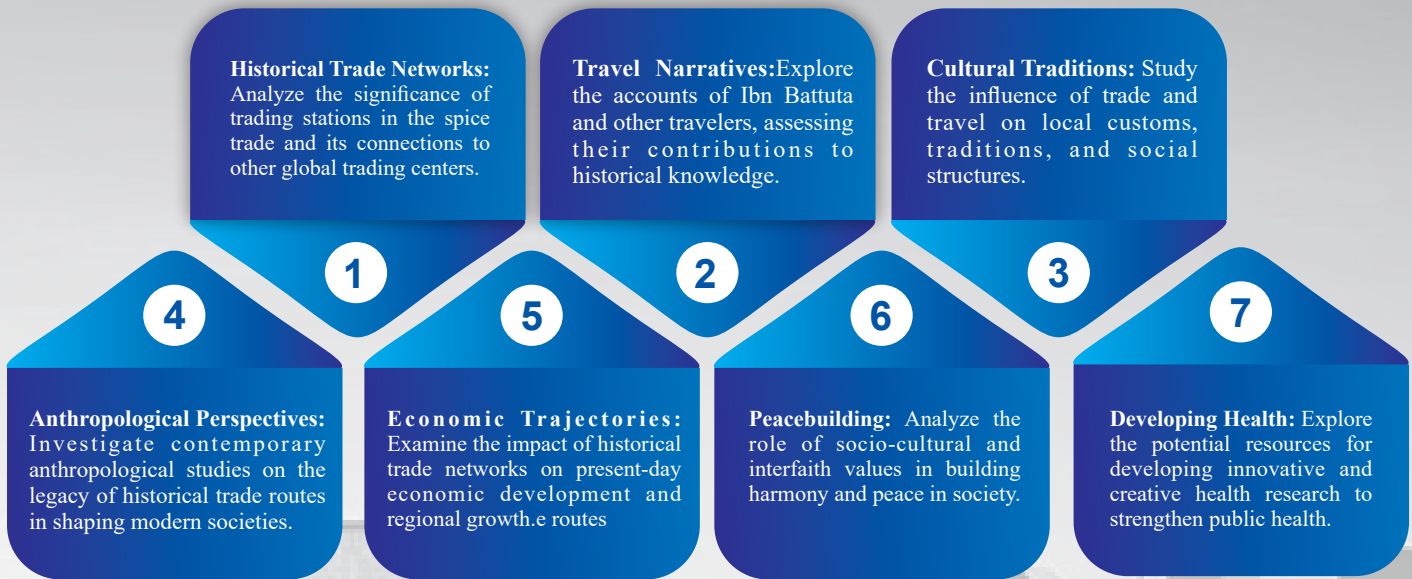
